Guidelines and Instructions:

Application deadline: April 20, 2020

The Norfolk Connecticut Children's Foundation Higher Education Scholarship is a one-time only award.

In order to be considered, your application must be submitted by April 20, 2020.

If you are taking a gap year or not matriculating directly to a college, university or technical program, your award may be deferred for up to three years from your graduation.

Norfolk must be your full time residence at the time of your application in order to be eligible for consideration.

Please completely fill out the scholarship application and return it to the Norfolk Connecticut Children's Foundation by snail or email. The layout is intended as a guide only. If you need more space to fully communicate with the board please use additional sheets. If you have any questions please contact us BEFORE the April deadline.

If you email your application to us, you will receive an email confirming receipt of it. This is NOT an automatic process so it will not be an immediate response. (A real live human will process your email and get back to you.) If you do not receive an email from us within 48 hours, it means we didn't get your application so resend it.
